Analyzes multiple sources of information in developing, evaluating, and disseminating intelligence on potential threats to U.S. and allied forces. Related DoD Occupational Subgroup: 124300.

## QUALIFICATIONS AND SELECTIONS FACTORS

Selection for this position will be made without regard to race, religion, color, creed, gender, or national origin. Applications are subject to review by the FSS Commander. If all mandatory requirements are met, applicants must meet an Interview Board. The requirements and qualifications prescribed in this announcement are the minimum for this position.

## DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Operates in a diverse and complex operational environment, supporting all aspects of Air Force operations to ensure U.S. dominance in air, space, and cyberspace. Supports Joint Force, Department of Defense, and National Intelligence Agency operations.
- Advises commanders on threats to U.S. and allied forces and missions as well as Intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR) capabilities and employment. Uses state-of-the-art technology to produce all-source intelligence, situation estimates, order-of-battle studies, and other intelligence reports and studies.
- Conducts external intelligence training. Instructs aircrews, security forces, explosive ordnance disposal and others on collecting and reporting requirements and procedures, recognition techniques, and assessing offensive and defensive weapon system capabilities.
- Assesses vulnerabilities of U.S. forces' telecommunications networks and information which could be collected and exploited by adversaries.
- Systematically assesses data using analytical procedures to document threats, isolate existing and potential vulnerabilities, identify procedures for minimizing and eliminating vulnerabilities, and recommend information Operations (IO) techniques to exploit vulnerabilities to a friendly advantage.

## **SPECIALTY QUALIFICATIONS**

**Knowledge:** Knowledge is mandatory of : intelligence organizations and systems; collection and reporting systems, procedures, and methods; intelligence sources; techniques of identifying, collating, evaluating, and analyzing information; geographical and cultural aspects of foreign countries; current military capabilities and employment tactics of potential enemy offensive and defensive weapon systems; special operations; procedures for acquiring, updating, maintaining intelligence documents, maps and charts; map and chart use techniques; graphic, oral and written presentation; support to targeting; and capabilities and application of automated data handling and management systems; security classification marking computerized systems supporting mission planning digital terrain and feature databases.

**Education:** For entry into this specialty, completion of high school or General Education Development equivalency, with courses in public speaking, journalism, geography, modern world history, statistics, algebra, geometry, trigonometry is desirable.

**Training:** For award of AFSC 1N031, completion of a basic operations intelligence course is mandatory.

**Other:** The following are mandatory as indicated:

- No speech disorders or noticeable communications deficiencies as defined by AFI 48-123, Medical Examinations and Standards.
- For award and retention of these AFSCs must maintain an Air Force Network License according to AFI 3-115, Vol 2, Licensing Network Users and Certifying Network Professionals.
- Specialty requires routine access to Top Secret material or similar environment. For award and retention of AFSCs 1N0X1, completion of a current Single Scope Background Investigation (SSBI) according to AFI 31-501, Personnel Security Program Management , is mandatory.
- Award of the 3-skill level without a completed SSBI is authorized provided an interim Top Secret clearance has been granted according to AFI 31-501.
- For award and retention of AFSC 1N0X1, when required for a current or future assignment, must successfully complete a polygraph test. .
